Dear Participants

First and foremost, thank you very much in signing up to the Amazing Thailand International Chiang Mai Enduro 2019. This is the first year we are part of the EWS Asia-Pacific Continental Series and this is the last round which is a decisive ground for the fastest and highest ranked riders to be crowned as Champions of EWS Asia-Pacific Continental Series 2019. The top 3 position of the EWS age categories will also be eligible to participate in 2020 Enduro World Series too! If you haven't yet became an EWS member do it now before the event starts.

Chiang Mai is more than ready to welcome you all to experience the vibrant and cultural heart of Northern Thailand or Lanna region. The mountain we will be riding throughout the event is Doi Suthep-Pui mountain, which is just 10 minutes away from the city. Riders can expect a wide variety of trails, from fast and flowy to steep and rocky, at elevations ranging from 300m (1000 ft) to 1400m (4500 ft) through a mix of evergreen forest to deciduous forest. Typical temperatures can range from 10 degrees C (50 Fahrenheit) at higher altitudes to 25 degrees C (77 Fahrenheit) at lower altitudes.

Getting to Chiang Mai couldn't be easier than taking a flight to Chiang Mai International Airport (CNX). If you booked the accommodation on the ICE Venue at Khum Phucome Hotel from us the shuttles will be picking you up. Our staff will be waiting for you at the international arrival terminal and the domestic terminal. In case of mishaps please do not hesitate to call our logistic coordinator Vivi at 095 687 9454.

| COURSE DESCRIPTION AND MAPS | Approximately 1,627m of ascending, 3,509m of descending, and 48.7 Km approximate distance Approximate total GC time: Approximately 30mins for fast riders, 60mins+ for average riders, 90mins+ for slower riders Approximate amount of climbing: One mechanical uplift to the start of Liaison Stage 1 and 5. All Liaison Stages are to be pedalled. Terrain Type: Tight and technical forested singletrack, wet roots and rocks, rain ruts, and some stream crossing. Course maps will be posted 23 Nov 2018 on our <u>Website</u> and <u>Facebook page</u> . |
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| SEEDING and RACE ORDER | The current standing positions of the top 10 riders of each categories from the EWS Asia-Pacific Continental Series will be used as "Qualification Seeding Order", the rest of the riders will be placed after that. The qualification results will be used to set rider's start times and waves start. >>>If you miss the morning shuttles, you will miss the qualification and your name will be put at the end of the start list on ICE Days.<<< |
| START LISTS | All riders will have allocated start time on SP1 and SP5, the rest of the course will be in "first come first serve" order. The start intervals is 30 seconds. |

| WATER STATIONS | Water stations will be located on various Liaison Stages, and elsewhere around the course where it is felt to be beneficial. These will be marked on a map at the Race Office. Riders are allowed to buy food and drink at the local shop where available but it is advisable to prepare your own. |
| TECH SUPPORT | Team / personal mechanics cannot fix rider's bikes during the race day. The riders must be ready to look after themselves out there. From 27 Nov there will be neutral mechanics (by Buu Bike) on hand and some spares that can be purchased if they are stuck (like inner tubes). All riders should bring their own specific spare parts, e.g. dropout hangers, bearing etc. |
